<u>Item 87</u> The Council consider a bid for the old Fire Station on Main Street from Gerard Fleury.

Discussion topics included not selling the fire station and using it for Town Office Space or general the Town should keep it for unknown future uses. Chief Dan Brooks said the sprinklers were disconnected because it was out of code and that the generator onsite was given to the Utilities District for pump station uses. The bidder daughter spoke and stated that possible uses were for apartments, storage or business use.

<u>Item 91</u> To discuss expiration of the Marijuana Moratorium and provide guidance to Town Staff and Planning Board on next actions to take concerning local regulations/zoning

Councilor Moran suggested extending the moratorium. Councilor Jenkins feels that nothing can be done as far as recreational marijuana because the State has no rules in place. Councilor Jenkins also feels that we will need information from the codes office and the planning board on where the Town may allow these types of businesses. The Council will revisit this topic at the September meeting. No further action.

Item 92 To discuss the process of hiring an interim and permanent town manager

Discussion was whether or not to consider hiring an interim manager and whether or not to hire Maine Municipal to manage the process of hiring a new Town Manager. Councilor Jenkins asked if any interim would be full-time or part-time. Councilor Fuller explained that the job of manager is very big in Winthrop and it should be full-time. Councilor Jenkins wanted to know what type of citizen involvement would there be in hiring a new manager. Councilor Fuller said we could discuss the process with David Barrett of Maine Municipal.

Councilor Caprara was excused from the meeting.

Patrice Putnam asked if the selection of an interim manager was going to be limited to a select few. Councilor Fuller explained that resume we have are a part of the Maine Municipal Pool of people that have expressed interest in serving as interim managers and that have municipal experience. No further action.
